Mitchell High School is a Years 7 to 12 comprehensive, multicultural high school in an attractive setting. It sits on six landscaped hectares in a quiet urban area. It has basketball and netball courts, expansive sporting fields, a COLA (Covered Outdoor Learning Area) and a large multi-purpose hall. There are approximately 1050 students, 80 teaching staff and 12 administration staff. The school is computer networked with internet access throughout the school.

Our school sets high standards in the academic, social and personal development of students, with emphasis on responsible behaviour, traditional values and individual excellence. Students at Mitchell High School are R.E.A.L. students: Respectful, Engaged and Active Learners.

Care and support of each student

Curriculum choices

Students in Years 7 and 8 experience a broad spectrum of subjects prior to making informed elective choices from the wide range available to them in Years 9 and 10. Talented students are offered the opportunity to participate in a High Achievers' Course in Year 9 in preparation for possible acceleration into HSC Courses. In addition, there is the opportunity for highly motivated, independent learners to apply for a position in our 'Self Select' classes in Years 7 to 10.

Our Senior students have achieved outstanding results in a wide range of Higher School Certificate courses.

Students may study Saturday School Community Languages, courses through the Open High School or TAFE courses in addition to the school based curriculum, often gaining skills and work place experience while undertaking vocational courses.

Individual education programs and special teacher support is provided for students with specific learning needs.
