

Last week at Mitchell High Year 7 and 9 students sat the NAPLAN assessments. NAPLAN stands for "National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy". NAPLAN helps governments, education authorities and schools to see whether young Australians are reaching important literacy and numeracy goals. It provides information about how education programs are working, areas for improvement. As well as being a snapshot of student literacy and numeracy NAPLAN practices students in a range of examination skills. In particular, their ability to focus for extended periods on one task. Increasingly students are demonstrating far greater problems in focusing on and completing complex tasks that are quite long such as the NAPLAN. Year 7 and 9 are to be commended for their work.

At Mitchell High, our mobile phone policy is that students have their mobile phones turned off and are in their bag during lessons. No exceptions. It is important that students are not distracted by their constant notifications that come up onto their homescreen and then proceed to check these. If your child uses their mobile phone to communicate independently with others or access the internet, it increases the risk that your child will come across content that bothers them. It also exposes your child to risks like cyberbullying, sexting, inappropriate content, and contact with strangers. You can help protect your child from risky or inappropriate content and activities by teaching your child about internet safety. Please talk with your child about: Managing safety and privacy settings on their phone – for example, checking that social media profiles are private and locking the phone with a pin, not entering personal details like name, address or date of birth into online accounts or forms. Accepting new social media friend requests only from people they know face to face, checking which apps use location services and switching off unnecessary ones. This can ensure that your child isn't showing their location to nearby people that they don't know. It is also important to remind your child that they must not share their passwords with their friends.

On Wednesday 18th May we held a face-to-face parent teacher evening, for year 7, 11 and 12. We thank all the parents who came to meet with their child's teacher and discuss how to best support their learning.

Special Religious Education

Mitchell High School offers Special Religious Education (SRE) to Years Seven to Eleven. There are six SRE sessions throughout the year, scheduled in assembly periods. Government-approved SRE providers offer an education in Catholic, Protestant, Orthodox and Muslim teachings. Students who do not wish to attend SRE attend Non-SRE classes, where activities focus on development of literacy, numeracy and revision, in accordance with the Special Religious Education Act. Upon enrolment, parents and guardians are provided with a permission note requesting SRE or non-SRE preference to allow allocation of Year Seven (or other grade) students to their preferred SRE or non-SRE class. Students are able to change these classes, with parental or guardian written permission, at any point. Links to SRE providers, including their content, and Scope and Sequences are found on the Mitchell High School website. The dates for SRE in 2022 are: Term One 9/3/22; Term Two 1/6/22 and 29/6/22; Term Three 27/7/22 and 7/9/22; Term Four 30/11/2022
